LISA CHIPETINE – "EVOLUTION OF THE ART QUILTER"

Lisa M. Chipetine is an enthusiastic and talented quilter of contemporary art quilts. Texture and movement interplay throughout her work, truly bringing it alive. Lisa combines a variety of mixed media techniques and materials to create visual illusions that there are multiple levels within the piece – even if the piece is only two-dimensional.

Being entirely self-taught, Lisa gives herself the freedom to constantly explore new areas and permission to think outside the box, without the fear of criticism. She believes "there are no mistakes ... there is only your art."

This presentation will be an interactive discussion regarding the definition of the "art quilt", evolution of art quilting, and taking an in-depth look at certain case studies of the evolution of several (continues on page 2)

The Guild received a gift of an unfinished quilt top started by a Japanese-American internee of one of the infamous internment camps during World War II. It is a hand-sewn Grandmother's Flower Garden so I volunteered to try and finish it since the first quilt I ever made was this pattern. I made mine as "TV" work using paper hexagons backing each piece and I thought that naturally it was made in a similar manner.

At that time we had not seen the actual quilt top and when I finally saw it in person I realized I was wrong --- it was made entirely without any paper backing and it is done really well. I am in awe of the workmanship and it is up to me to try and finish it.

So it seems my summer project is all set. I hope I can do justice to this project which has historic value to those of us who remember those days and realize now what an injustice was done to many loyal American citizens who were disenfranchised during another time when we were at war.
