#### WE'VE BONDED WITH JOAN SHAY



Joan Shay is an award-winning quilter from Cape Cod, Massachusetts. She has developed a unique appliqué technique that she calls Appli-bond<sup>©</sup>. The technique allows you to create 3-Dimensional motifs. It is quick and easy because turning and sewing edges are eliminated. Two layers of fabric are bonded together and the design is cut on the line with no seam allowance. If you have bonded the fabric properly you will not have fraying even when washed and dried, and you will be

able to curl and shape the pieces.

Joan is the author of "Petal by Petal", "Petal Play the Traditional Way" and "3 Quilters Celebrate the 4 Seasons". She has also published articles in The American Quilter, Miniature Quilts; Quilting is Hot, Quilting Today and Patchwork & Quilting in the United Kingdom. Joan travels nationally and internationally teaching at guilds, conferences and shops. We are truly delighted that she will be with us!






