QUILT TOPS NEEDED FOR CHARITY DAY!

It's time for our annual Charity Quilting Day! Throughout the day we will be putting our efforts into making as many quilts as possible for the charities that the guild supports. The activities go on all day — beginning at approximately 10:00 am. Please come as early as you can.

We would like to remind all our members that this is the time to bring all your tops that you have been working on, and if you have any suitable backing fabric, or some backing fabric you might like to donate, please bring it in. The more we have, the nicer the quilts will be.

Also, we would like to remind the members to bring in their basic sewing supplies, i.e. pins, scissors, thread, tying needles, etc. The guild will be supplying batting, donated by the City Quilter, as they always generously do, and floss to tie the quilts with. We will have an iron available, a cutting board and a rotary cutter. If you are planning on bringing your machine, please do - the more the merrier. Hope to make this a great day, with lots of fun and creativity.

Don't miss this opportunity to participate in one of the main activities of the **Empire Quilters**. You will learn, laugh and get to know your fellow guild members at this once-a-year activity. Last year we made over 100 quilts in one day — a record! The quilt pictured on page 1 is from last year's charity day.

We can also use some large cutting mats and sharp rotary cutters. But most importantly - bring yourself! There are plenty of experienced quilters on hand who are able and willing to show everyone how to participate. The charity committee saves large pieces of fabric from the scrap table, so we will do our best to match your quilt top with a quilt back.

FABRIC SHOPPING IN CONNECTICUT

In mid October, a few of us quilters decided that it would be nice to leave the hustle and bustle of the City for a foliage and quilting weekend in the country. We decided on Connecticut, because, as a result of our fabulous website, we received an e-mail from Mary Ann Gunning, the Innkeeper of Chapin Park, a bed and breakfast in a house dating back to 1871. The house is approximately two hours out of the City in a very "New England" type of town and it is right next door to a typical country style church.

She said that she was open to hosting quilting weekend retreats as she herself is a quilter, having made two of the quilts that cover beds in one of the rooms.



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

APRIL BLOCK OF THE MONTH



A Basket for Your May Flowers

This block is a 5 ½ inch square unfinished (5 inch finished)

Fabrics are:

Yellow for the background

Four bright, spring-like colors for the basket

One dark red or brown for the handle

This is an easy paper pieced basket. The dimensions for the various pieces are as follows:

1 – Background – yellow – 2 ½ X 4 ½

2 & 3 – basket handles – 1 X 3 ½

4 & 5 – background – yellow – a 2 ¾ X 2 ¾ inch square cut diagonally

6 – basket – 1 ½ X 4 ½

7 – basket – 1 X 4 ½

8 – basket – 1 ½ x 4 ½


9 – basket – 1 ¾ X 4 ½

10 & 11 – background – yellow – a 2 ¼ X 2 ¼ inch square cut diagonally

12 & 13 – background – yellow – 1 ¼ X 5

14 – background – yellow – 1 ¼ X 5 ¾

Trim block to 5 ½ X 5 ½ square unfinished

Brilliant Baby Quilt/Bag

Do you need to make a baby quilt, and want to make it stand out from the other gifts? Leave it to guild member **Janet Randolph** to come up with just the thing to *wow* the new parents. Janet will demonstrate how to make a quilt that turns into a bag (or is it a bag that opens into a quilt?). The technique involves placing zippers on one side to turn the quilt into a tote bag.

Face Studies

Face studies is an informal study of creating facial expressions and moods to represent our full range of feelings using a variety of approaches in the journal quilt size format of 8½ x 11 inches.

Group participants will experiment with different backgrounds and face colors using solids and textures and prints. You will create the face using fused fabrics and embroidery, top stitching, ribbons, beads and any type of embellishment you can think of to attach to the face.

In April, the group will work towards embellishing, embroidery and finishing touches.

Supply List: Bring background and face fabrics (8½ x 11) plus lots of scraps and pins so you can play and create facial features.
