MACHINE SASHIKO WITH SHARON PEDERSON

Sharon Pederson is a Canadian quiltmaker, teacher and best selling author of several books. She began teaching in 1987 and loves her work — plus she's very good at it! After the publication of her first book, her teaching work expanded by leaps and bounds. She has taught at many major conferences including Quilting-by-the Lake, the International Quilt Festivals in Chicago, and Houston, the World Quilt & Textile Conference, the Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara, the Pan Pacific Show in Hawaii, and more!

We're delighted that she found time in her busy schedule to come to Empire Quilters. Sharon is the author of Reversible Quilts: Two at a Time — which has been re-printed six times! — More Reversible Quilts, and Color for the Terrified Quilter which she co-authored with Ionne McCauley. Sharon's book Sensational Sashiko: Japanese Appliqué and Quilting by Machine was released in late 2005. Included in the 96 page book are instructions on how to choose machine friendly sashiko patterns, draw them the size you want, transfer the image to your fabric, and using your sewing machine with heavy weight thread, stitch out the designs easily and efficiently. Come hear Sharon talk to the guild about all these interesting topics.

SENSATIONAL SASHIKO BY MACHINE WORKSHOP

Date: April 13, 2008 Time: 9:30am – 4:00pm

Sharon takes a non-traditional approach to a traditional needle art form. "My theory is that if it can be done by hand, it can be done by machine and sashiko is no exception." Originating as the "common" man's garment decoration, sashiko has been adopted by quilters to add exciting designs to their quilt tops and garments. Using your sewing machine and heavy weight threads learn how to achieve this stunning embellishment on either a single thickness of fabric or through a quilt "sandwich".

This is a process workshop — not a project one. You will be making five small samples: four on a quilt 'sandwich' and one on two layers of fabric (minus the batting).

WORKSHOP SUPPLIES:

Sewing machine (essential) and, if you have one, an open toed embroidery foot. Bring your machine manual, accessories box, an extension cord, and an extra bobbin case if you have one.

FABRIC:

Four 9-inch square pieces navy blue cotton

Four 9-inch square pieces cotton/poly batting (such as Hobbs Heirloom Cotton, or Warm & Natural)

Four 9-inch square pieces backing fabric

Also: a 'sandwich' at least 6" square of the same fabrics as above to test your stitches on. **Do not pin the three layers together until you get to class.** We have to mark a grid on them first.

Also: please bring one 9-inch square of navy blue cotton, spray glued to a 9-inch square of muslin or plain (no prints please) light colored fabric. We will be marking our patterns on the muslin/plain side so prints would be distracting. Bring a small scrap of these as well to test stitch quality and tension on (3 or 4-inches square will be large enough).

THREAD: A heavy weight white thread such as White YLI Jeanstitch or Mettler Metrosene Cordonnet (these are both polyester threads), and 50/3 navy blue cotton thread for the bobbin. If you have any other heavy weight threads, bring them to play with. YLI Variegated Jeanstitch is a fun one.

NEEDLES: One 100/16 Topstitching needle and one 80/12 Universal

PENS/PENCILS:

A silver or white marking pencil & pencil sharpener

A washable blue marker or a 4H or 2H pencil

A fine tip permanent marker for the template plastic

TEMPLATE PLASTIC: One sheet of see-through template plastic and something to cut it with. Or you can purchase a template in class for \$4.00

MISCELLANEOUS: Rotary cutter, mat and small see-through ruler (6" x 12" is good), fabric eraser, safety pins, straight pins, stitch ripper, regular sewing supplies, and masking tape. Sharon's book *Sensational Sashiko: Japanese Appliqué and Quilting by Machine (Martingale & Co).*

April 12th Focus Groups are open to all members and take place in our 8th floor meeting area.

Quilt with Mask

Time: Starting at 9:00 am Group Leader: Anna Faustino

Create a small (22" x 22") quilt with any mask your imagination can reach, from scraps of fabrics. African, Indian, Chinese, Carnival, personal, decorative — any inspirational subject is possible!

Supply List:

22" x 22" background fabric (not too graphic), cutting board and rotary cutter, Iron and extension cord, scraps of bright colorful fabrics, paper and pencil, pins, Heat 'n Bond Light

Brilliant Baby Quilt/Bag Time: Starting at 10:00 am Group Leader: Janet Randolph ***This focus group is full***

Do you need to make a baby quilt, and want to make it stand out from the other gifts? Leave it to guild member Janet Randolph to come up with just the thing to wow the new parents. Janet will demonstrate how to make a quilt that turns into a bag (or is it a bag that opens into a quilt?). The technique involves placing zippers on one side to turn the quilt into a tote bag.

Special note ... Due to the space required to place the zippers properly, this focus group has a limit of 15 people participating (and it is now FULL). Those who pre-registered with Janet Randolph have their supply list. Additional members are welcome to observe the technique (and go home with instructions).

Face Studies

Time: After the general meeting (approx 3:30 – 5:00 pm)

Group Leader: Sandra Naval

Note ... The second half of this workshop was originally scheduled for February 9, 2008 but was postponed to April 12, 2008.

Face studies is an informal study of creating facial expressions and moods to represent our full range of feelings using a variety of approaches in the journal quilt size format of $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inches.

Group participants will experiment with different backgrounds and face colors using solids and textures and prints. You will create the face using fused fabrics and embroidery, top stitching, ribbons, beads and any type of embellishment you can think of to attach to the face.

In April, the group will work towards embellishing, embroidery and finishing touches.

Supply List: Bring background and face fabrics (8½ x 11) plus lots of scraps and pins so you can play and create facial features.






