MAY WORKSHOP

Barbara Barber says Aloha! Sunday, May 11, 2008; 9:30am – 4:00pm Cost : \$50.00 343 Eighth Ave. at 27th St. (near McDonald's)

A multi-technique class which encompasses several aspects of machine work. The circle is manipulated and used in fun and ingenious ways. Learn a whole new approach to appliqué that guarantees smooth curves in simple shapes. The appliqué is simple but effective and can be done before quilting or later using the "appli-quilt" technique. Sewn in any colour scheme it's lots

of fun because it somehow feels like a bit of a cheat but it's not – you are simply creating a really fun quilt in super quick time!

SUPPLY LIST:

Sewing machine, Thread to match fabric, Usual sewing kit, Foolproof Circles® for rotary cutting, Square ruler for rotary cutting that is at least 7" square, Rotary cutter- mat- ruler, A variety of fabrics, all pre-starched to give a crisp finish. See website for starching instructions.

QUILTER OF THE MONTH

In 1994, Sandra Samaniego took an adult education quilting class in Jersey City and made a sampler quilt. A year later she joined the Jersey City Quilters Guild, a small group (20 or so members still), and then joined Empire a few years later. She is also a recent member of Quilters of Color Network in New York. Sandra has always liked work that was "outside of the box"-- non traditional, contemporary, art quilts -- the best. Sandra's training is as a clinical psychologist. This past September she was able to work 4 longer days a week instead of 5 days at Lenox Hill Hospital Out Patient Center for Mental Health where she has worked for the past 28 years. Consequently, she has been able to complete lots of projects. Sandra is a much happier camper as a result. She also encourages and teaches patients with whom she works who express an interest in crafts to make quilts, dolls, etc. and provides them with fabric and yarn (from her stash). They find it helps them psychologically to feel less depressed, less anxious, have improved self esteem and to beautify their homes and lives. Sandra is largely self taught but learns much from books and magazines as well as from craft and quilt shows on TV. She also visits lots of art galleries, quilt and craft shows. In addition to quilting Sandra creates altered books, dolls (she belongs to the Manhattan Doll Guild which meets at City Quilter monthly) and incorporates other art/crafts techniques into her quilts (beading, painting, found objects, etc).

PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE - 2009 SHOW: COLOR MY WORLD

In keeping with the bright colors of our 2009 Show Quilt – Broadway Jane – I'm proposing a colorful challenge for the members for the 2009 Show that I hope will bring out a child-like enthusiasm and sense of possibilities.

Select a color from a box of crayons. Then use this as the focal point for your quilt. You could choose to use the color as the principal color in your quilt, or use the name of the color as a theme. The title of your quilt must include the crayon color name. **Size**: not to exceed 22 inches on any side. **Media:** any media - but this must be a quilted item.

I will bring a box of crayons to the May and June meeting for you to select from – or if you have your own box of crayons, you can pick from your box.

Face Studies


What we will need for step 2 is:

* one piece of background fabric, 9x11 1/12", not solid - a fabric that will set a mood; * piece of batting or flannel ironed on its back, * an oval face shape, wonder-undered; and either sewn or basted to backing fabric. *an assortment of small pieces of fabric on wonder-under for face features. * fabric or embellishments for hair and other details, * scissor, * iron, * a willingness to play!!!!


