I recommend that you start thinking now—and volunteering now—to get to do the jobs you're most interested in.

All of us came to Empire for one common reason—the love of quilting. Enjoy what we currently have, participate in the activities, and look for a new person you might be able to help.

Remember to pay your dues by October 15, otherwise you can't enter the show.

LIBRARY

Welcome back everyone from the long hot Summer. Having spent a good part of the Spring and Summer of this year at home with a broken knee, I really appreciated being able to order books online from the New York Public Library. I always think it's sad that the NYPL has so few quilting books available. On the other hand, our Empire Library owns over four hundred quilting books of all types. We take twenty to twenty-five books to most meetings, and the list of books is available to see on our web site. A list of the books is also available to view at the Membership table. Members can reserve a book, by email or phone at least one week before a meeting. We ask members about new books they would like us to add to our library. And, in this column we mention specific books that we will bring to a meeting. Sometimes we choose books that connect with the monthly speaker, or just books that are new to the library. Last year I chose not to buy any new books for the library, because there was such a small group of library users. Every month about twenty members borrow books, but this is only thirty or so different guild members who use the library. Do you want this service to continue? Vote by doing — use the library, volunteer in support of the library. It doesn't seem to make a lot of sense to continue to manage the book portion of the library for so few active users.

We will look at how much demand there is for the book section of the library these coming months. Unless we can get more interest in members borrowing books, we should consider selling all of the books the Guild owns and maybe just sell magazines at the monthly meetings. Many members donate magazines (a few books are also donated), but the magazine sale is big every month.

The library crew is tried and true, but we need some new faces and new bodies. We meet once a month at Tina Barth's loft (where the books are kept). Tina serves high tea and we sort books for the upcoming meeting. We also keep track of the books, decide what books to take to a meeting and do all of the paperwork involving the library. We also need to have library help during the meetings to cover sales and recording book returns and books borrowed. Please take advantage of this wonderful service and perhaps join us as a library volunteer.

At our September meeting, several donations for the library are: *Log Cabin in the Round Design*., *Stack the Deck*, *Stack a New Deck*, and *Quick Star Quilts and Beyond*. Remember, for those members who did not return their books by the June meeting, I will contact you individually regarding their late fines. And, our annual book sale will take place on October 9, 2010. All books will be \$2.00, and the sale will run from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Come early, last year the sales began at noon and most books were gone by a little after noon!

SUGGESTION BOX

The following are the suggestions that were placed in the Suggestion Box in June. We are getting lots of good suggestions, some of which will be brought up at the Board meeting in September. If you would like to respond, please email your response to Kitty Squire at kesquilts33@msn.com and responses will be published in this space.

- For members teaching members: English paper piecing, beginning hand appliqué.
 - Keep speakers to 45 minutes for their entire presentation—Use a timer and let them know ahead of time that they will be cut off when time is up.
 - Publish Block of the Month in the newsletter
 - Ask FIT to provide separate receptacles for recyclable cans, bottles, paper and textiles
 - The business part of the meeting is too long, rambling and disorganized. People who want to speak should plan ahead of time what they want to say, having notes if they need them. They should be near the front, ready to speak, like with Show and Tell. The rest of the meeting is too rushed. What's the hurry? We rent the room till 6. Some members say they "have to" leave early, but actually they choose to. Their choices should not limit the rest of us. Always give a break after the speaker, or before if the business part is very long.
 - Have Quilter of the Month every month except December and March. It helps us get to know one another, makes a large group friendlier.

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


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
