#### **Live Auction Rules:**

When you arrive at the meeting, sign in and receive a paddle with your special number. Purchases from the live auction can be paid for by cash or check at the conclusion of the auction. Items are sold as is so come early and take a look at the items that will be on display for the live auction

### **Other Fun Opportunities:**

**President's Table** — A table filled with treasures you supply or donations that are not going into the live auction or onto the Quick Fix board. This table is a first come, first choice cash/check and carry table. Sales will be opened before the live auction. Please bring items for the table or bring cash/checks to purchase!

Please do not use buttons on the bears (for child safety reasons).

For December, we are making the following: 6-inch block: King's Star on page 44 of SBS.

12-inch block: Carpenter's Wheel on page 56 of ECO.

Additional (optional) block: Grape Basket

6-inch block: page 37 of SBS

12-inch block: pattern to be provided

We will be meeting monthly in 2011 and working in the same format: 6 inch and 12 inch blocks. We decided at the November meeting to continue with the 6 inch blocks from Sylvia's Bridal Sampler ("SBS") and will begin using the More Elm Creek ("MEC") for the 12 inch blocks. Both books are by Jennifer Chiaverini. The 6 inch block for January will

be Indiana Rose (appliqué) and the alternate block is Hunters Star (paper piecing), see the index in SBS for page numbers. The 12 inch blocks will be a Mother's Favorite block with the Peace & Plenty center. The alternate block will be a Mother's Favorite block with a Pinwheel center from the New Year's Reflections Quilt on page 80 of More Elm Creek.

ECQ: Elm Creek Quilts: Quilt Projects Inspired by the Elm Creek Quilts Novels by J. Chiaverini and N. Odom.

### **CHARITY**

If you are unsure how to draw on the eyes, nose and mouth, don't worry about it — it will be done for you.

The Holiday collection started a few years ago with teddy bears and stockings, and this is our claim to fame. The toiletries and games, coloring books, etc. were a welcome addition and have gone over very well, but we need our teddy bear makers in full force. You only need (2) 12 inch pieces of fabric to make a bear — it takes little time to sew and brings so much joy and happiness to a child who may be in a situation where they had to leave a favorite toy behind or just have no toy at all. In the past, I have left copies of thank you notes from Moms in the shelters and the kids themselves thanking us for not forgetting them, so Empire Quilters, let's not forget them. Please make your bears so we can help make kids happy this year. If all our members just make one bear, think of the joy it will bring.

As a reminder, any food items that are contributed must be individually wrapped and will be used for the shelter holiday party when the gifts are distributed. Empire Quilters is responsible for the holiday party and gift distribution for three shelters. That is an extraordinary effort and our membership must be congratulated for a great job. We put the smiles on the faces of so many kids and assure them that they have not been forgotten this holiday season.

### CRAZY CAT LADY SEEKS CAGE BLANKETS...

...to bring comfort to NYC's shelter animals. I am now coordinating Empire's Cage Comforter project. We're making small quilts and blankets to line the cages at NYC animal shelters. When shelter pets (both cats and small dogs) have soft beds to sleep on, they're happier, less stressed, and healthier, which means they're adopted sooner. This helps to reduce the overcrowding at NYC's shelters. Some shelters even let the pets take their blankets with them to their new homes.

You can either sew, knit or crochet a cage comforter. The only requirements are that they be at least 12" x 18" (but they can be larger) and that they be machine washable. ### MD ANDERSON CANCER CENTER QUILT AUCTION


