
Special Guest Speaker Jan Krentz • Members Teaching Members

PROGRAM - JAN KRENTZ

We are delighted to announce that celebrated artist, author, designer and teacher Jan Krentz is planning to "drop by" our meeting and do a mini (as in *short, sweet, and fast!*) trunk show! Jan is in the area and has agreed to share some of her fabulous (and famous!) works with us.

Jan Krentz is the author of Lone Star Quilts & Beyond, Hunter Star Quilts & Beyond, Diamond Quilts and Beyond, Quick Star Quilts & Beyond, and Quick Diamond Quilts. She holds the honor of being The Professional Quilter's 1998 Teacher of the Year, and is consistently nominated year after year for that award. She has had numerous appearances on television, online, and has been the featured quilter in many prestigious quilt shows.

PROGRAM - MEMBERS TEACHING MEMBERS

We have already had a terrific response to our Members Teaching Members Workshops. Over 127 members have signed up for the classes — some of them for more than one class. These classes are taught simultaneously, so that you can only take one class. Please think about which one you would like it to be or if you have not already signed up, please let Kitty Squire know your preference (kesquilts33@msn.com | 718-541-5545). Our teachers need to get an approximate head count in order to make kits and be prepared. Some class sizes are limited. The class lineup is as follows:

Traditional Hand Appliqué — Tina Barth

Learn how to make sharp points and lovely rounded curves without using fusing! There is a class limit of 25 for this class, so be sure to sign up early.

Supply List: small scissors, straight pins, and needle threaders.

Felt Appliqué — Pauline Hazard

Make an appliqué wool bracelet that is also a wallet — a wristlet — from felted and recycled wool.

Supply List: Scissors for fabric and fabric adhered to freezer paper, embroidery threads, embroidery needle, sewing needle, straight pins, beads and embellishments (optional).

Note: Felted wool will only be provided for the first 20 individuals to sign up. Individuals signing up after the first 20 will be welcome in the class, but will need to bring your own felted wool, as well as the items in the supply list.

Embroidered Quilt Labels — Renee Fields

Learn to design and create an embroidered label for your quilt.

Supply List: 6" embroidery hoop, 8" square solid fabric ironed onto a piece of freezer paper, soft pencil, chalk, or disappearing ink pen, embroidery needle(s), embroidery thread. Optional: assorted embellishments (beads, buttons, ribbon thread, or lace).

Sweatshirt Jacket — Naomi Shelnut

Naomi will be demonstrating how to make a gorgeous jacket out of a basic sweatshirt.

Supply List: One over-sized fleece sweatshirt preferably a man's XL (color of your choice), fabric strips (2" – 2½" wide), preferably three to five different colors (prints mixed with solids, etc.), thread (neutral color), scissors and straight pins.

English Paper Piecing — Diane Rubenstein

Learn how to make beautiful Grandmother Flower Garden quilts. Diane Rubenstein will be providing a small kit, so it is important that you sign up early!

Supply List:

- Paper for each piece (The best paper is the cards found in magazine inserts. You can also use construction paper or some people use freezer paper, but I have never tried this.)
- Sharp pencils and sharpener or mechanical pencil. Bring a white or silver pencil if using dark fabrics.
- Paper scissors AND fabric scissors.
- Thread use up your old wonky colors for basting (this can be polyester), PLUS nice neutral cotton sewing thread that will fade into your fabric selection use a dark if mostly dark fabrics.
- · A few straight pins.
- Hand sewing needles in a size that you prefer.
- Fabric scraps of your choice. If using total scraps decide if you want each flower all the same or total scrappy. If doing total scrappy, bring a piece enough for each middle (that will remain constant) i.e. Red, Pink, or Yellow, or any color that floats your boat! Middle color looks best if solid or a blender.
 - Fabric can be in strips (which are what I prefer) at a minimum of 3.5" or 4" for ease of working. Scraps should be at least 4" square.
- Optional: Ultra Fine Sharpee to mark a plastic template

Art Quilting — Sandra Samaniego

Participants will create 3D embellishments including fabric beads and fabric bundles. Sandra will talk briefly about art quilts in general and show a few that she has made that have a lot of embellishments.

Supply List: All supplies will be provided, including fabric scraps, glue sticks, sewing needles, novelty thread.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH: FASHION LABELS

Members have been asking to do the fashion labels blocks again, so here it is, but a little different this time. The foundation blocks are 8" square made from solid cottons in taupe, ivory, tan, brown, gray, any neutral. Arrange your labels using a glue stick to hold them in place. Machine applique (folding under any raw edges). Add yo-yos and buttons if you like. They fill in the holes.

CHARITY

Many thanks to our members who braved the cold weather to attend the meeting. We are aware that everyone is busy working on their show quilts, but March is Empire's Charity Month. Last year our guild contributed 140 quilts to various agencies through the City, each quilt more beautiful than the next. So, Empire Quilters, let's make sure we keep up all our good work! If you have quilt tops or bottoms ready and will not be at the March meeting, we will collect them at the February meeting and bring them back for the March meeting to be quilted.

For the March meeting, the Charity Committee will have some supplies, but we ask that members bring their own supplies to use during the day, such as pins, scissors, rulers, white thread and tying needles. The Guild will supply batting, any tops and backs handed in so far this year, tying material, a cutting board and a rotary cutter and an iron. Donated batting will be available for use at 8:30 a.m., so those who are dropping off their quilts for judging can start to work on charity quilts. We also need to call upon our generous members who come with their sewing machines as they are vital to this day — just make sure you remember to bring your extension cord.

Again, we know you are working hard on your show quilts, but in keeping with the philosophy of our wonderful guild and our generous membership, let's remember those who continue to need us. Can you believe it's almost show time?!? Here is what you need to know between now and the Show:

PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE DEADLINE EXTENDED

If you didn't submit a quilt for the President's Challenge, there is still time! The Show Committee has extended the deadline for the President's Challenge submissions *only* to Saturday, February 12. You may submit your entry form and photo in person at the February meeting from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., or by mail. Please note that mail-in submissions need to be received by Friday, February 11. The theme of this year's President's Challenge is New York City Landmarks. Take a photo, or get out your lightbox and starting tracing...be creative! We look forward to seeing your entries.

All other deadlines remain unchanged. As a reminder, there is NO entry fee for the President's challenge,.

VOLUNTEERING

Remember if you don't have a quilt in the show, you can still volunteer, and we need your help! We especially need assistance with the set-up/take down of the show. If your spouse is willing to come and help, it would be appreciated. The more men we have, the better, as the set-up and take down requires some physical effort to set up frames, curtains, and quilts. Committee chairs will be contacting volunteers to assign their specific time slot between now and the end of February.

JUDGING — MARCH 5, 2011

If your quilt is being judged then please remember that you need to bring it to the March 5th guild meeting between 7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.. Your quilt will not be accepted for judging if you are not on line by 9:30 a.m.. You will receive a receipt for your quilt on Saturday that you will need in order to pick up your quilt on Sunday, March 6th between 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.. If you cannot pick up your quilt, please indicate who will pick up your quilt on the receipt and please make sure that the person has proper ID to pick up the quilt.

QUILT SUBMISSIONS DROP OFF — MARCH 25, 2011

Please drop off your quilt for the show on Friday, March 25th between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. and please remember that you will need to pick up your quilt after the show on Sunday, March 27th between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m.. The drop off and pickup location is in the Reeves Great Hall on 28th and 7th Avenue, not our usual location.

Several reminders for submitting your quilts:

- Each quilt must arrive for hanging in its own PILLOWCASE CLOTH BAG. The bag MUST BE LABELED with YOUR NAME, PHONE NUMBER AND/OR E-MAIL ADDRESS and the NAME OF THE QUILT. A picture of the quilt on the pillowcase would be helpful but not required.
- No external hardware or wrappings other than the cloth bag will be accepted.
- There will be no special hanging of quilts.
- No rigid frames, mounting devices, or special lighting will be allowed.

Placing an ad in the program is a particularly good idea for anyone having something to sell in the boutique.
