Dear Ms. Ebs,

I would like to thank you for the quilts that your group has already provided to the newborns of Freedom House, our emergency domestic violence shelter. Janice Ewing, who is a member of the parish where I am a Priest Associate, suggested writing you and outlining what our total need for quilts might be. Our director reported that we generally get 12 new adults and 15 new children every month. We have a capacity for 95 residents at a time. Residents may stay anywhere from 90-180 days in shelter (180 being the maximum that they are allowed to stay).

We understand that giving one to everyone would be a tremendous number of quilts. My wife and I collaborate on quilt-making when we can, so we appreciate how much work is involved.

We would appreciate any number of quilts that you could donate to our cause. Freedom House is part of the Barrier Free Living Family of Companies. I have enclosed a copy of our IRS determination letter to document that we are a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. If you would like to learn more about us, our web site is www.bflnyc.org.


