This block can be made from a variety of $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ scraps, such as pieces of left-over binding. Cut 10 strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. 5 strips of different colors and 5 strips of white or off white.

- Sew the strips together into two $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ striped blocks by alternating the white and colored strips. One block has 3 colored strips and the other has 2 colored strips.

- With the stripes in a vertical position, cut the blocks on the diagonal from the bottom right to the top left. Cut both blocks this way, otherwise it will not go together in this design.

- Rotate the 4 triangles made from the striped blocks into the final design. Sew together. There is ONLY ONE SEAM THAT NEEDS MATCHING.
- The completed block measures $131 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 131 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Want more than one block at a time? A jelly roll sorted 20 dark and 20 light can be strip pieced into 8 WOF striped strips. Each WOF strip can be cut into four striped $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ blocks, making 32 blocks to cut diagonally becoming 16 split parquet blocks. No white or off white needed.
