### EMPIRE QUILTERS GUILD FUNDRAISER 2004



At the December 11<sup>th</sup> meeting the Guild is hosting several fundraising activities that we ask you to participate in. There will be a Live Auction, a Silent Auction, a Bake Sale/Flea Market, and a Raffle. We'd like you to help out in three ways: (1) donate items to the auctions and sales, (2) volunteer to help manage the event the day of the December meeting, and (3) bring along guests (and your or their wallet) to help buy some of the great items for sale. With the holiday season it will make a great gift shopping opportunity.

Live Auction: We are looking for items of value that you feel another person in the Guild may be interested in bidding on and purchasing. It can be quilting or handicraft-related but may also be any item or service that you would like to contribute. It can be a finished item or new quilting material – it can be a regifted item you received but cannot use or a service you could provide.

<u>Silent Auction</u>: These items will be displayed on a table along the side of the meeting room. You will have a chance to bid on them during the course of the meeting and during the Live Auction. The highest bidder wins! You can then pay for your winning bid at the end of the meeting.

Bake Sale/Flea Market: Please consider donating at least one baked selection to the Bake Sale table. Bring it packaged to sell. Our volunteers will price it and take it from there. For example, you could bring in a dozen cookies, assorted holiday baking on a foil tray or a small cake. Let your

imagination run. For the Flea Market, you may want to contribute a completed holiday handicraft or decoration. These items will be attractively priced by our volunteers to ensure they sell. Any leftovers will find their way to the following month's raffle table.

Volunteer: Besides donating items to the Guild's fundraisers above, we could also use a few abled volunteers on the day of the event. We need a live auctioneer with gusto, 4 spotters and item 2 cashiers. runners. recorder/scribe, 3-4 bidding assistants for the Silent Auction and subsequent check-out of winning bidders, and 2-3 staff for the Bake Sale/Flea Market table. Guild member Michael Greenberg coordinating this is fundraiser and he would like you to contact him if you can help or if you have questions. Bid Big, Bid Often: Ideally we would like to have successful bidders pay for the item at the time of the sale. They can pay the bid spotter/runner as the item is delivered to them. If you plan on buying several items, you can have an IOU recorded until the end of the event. Then you can pay for your multiple purchases all at once with cash or a personal check. Bid spotters/runners will have IOU's and the auction recorder will also have your winning bid written down.

How to Donate: You can do this in several ways: You can bring the item to the November meeting and Michael will collect the donated item and bring it to the Auction/Sale. Or there will be two drop-off locations in the City at Guild members' apartments with doormen to receive packages (information below) or you can notify Michael (see his email and phone number above) as to what Cont. on next page.
