Mary Anne Ciccotelli - "The Legacy Lives On: Five Generations of Quilters"

Mary Anne Ciccotelli will entertain us with the quilting legacy that is in her family, sharing a little about the lives of the quilters who came before her and explaining how she is passing on the love of quilting to her daughters and grand-daughter. During the presentation, she will show five generations of quilts that she has in her home. Also, Mary Anne will talk about her discovery of how you can do more than just put sashings between blocks. You will see more than 20 quilts during the trunk show portion of the presentation.

Mary Anne graduated from Brigham Young University majoring in Business Education with a minor in Business Management. As her daughters were growing, she was a stay-at-home mom while also working in the mortgage industry.

Having always thought of making quilts for those in need or comfort, after the attacks on the WTC in 2001, she felt compelled to reach out to those families affected in her Westchester community. Being a quilter, she decided to make a quilt for each of the 10 families that had lost someone in the tragedy. The response to her internet request for blocks was so overwhelming that over 30 quilts were made and distributed.

Mary Anne teaches quilting classes in her home studio (the Pelham Art Center) and at Pins and Needles. She also teaches children's sewing classes in her studio and in the local grade schools.

She is a member of Pelham Quilters, The Village Square Quilters, Northern Star Quilter's Guild and Empire Quilters. Mary Anne lives in Pelham, New York with her husband Tom. She is a mother and grandmother.





BLOCK OF THE MONTH

The assortment of flowers and butterflies on the wall for the May Block of the Month was outstanding. I enjoyed looking at them and I hope you did also. The participants were: Carmen Caldeiro (2), Veronique Milliez (2), Naomi Shelnut (2), Marian Webber (1), and Beth Pile (1) who won them all in the drawing.

SEP 2005 BLOCK OF THE MONTH STARRY PATH

12 inch finished block



This block has a deceptive appearance. It looks really difficult but it is not. What you need to do is to consider that it is really four triangles. To obtain these triangles you need to cut it on both diagonals. I did that to the paper block (which is on the Internet web site) to make that more apparent. Each triangle has the point of one color and the base of another. The block seemed to me that it was calling for bold colors, so that is what I used to make it, and recommend that you do that also.

You need to add 1/4" seam allowance to all the pieces, but if you will look at the pattern pieces you will see that I have drawn an arrow on one side of pattern pieces **c** and **d**. These are the white pieces. I placed the arrows on the outside edges of the pieces and allowed 1/2" seam allowance at that side (1/4" just didn't work). You can trim off the extra when you have finished the block.

Making the block is not difficult if you first cut out all the pieces and arrange them so that you will not be confused about where the pieces will be placed. After that, all you have to do is to sew them. Once

again, I will bring the pattern pieces to the June meeting so that you can pick them up from me and they will also be at www.empirequilters.net. Also, as before, if you need help or pattern pieces, just give me a call at 212-662-6181. Have a great summer!




