



PROGRAM

This month's program will be "We've Bonded" with Joan Shay. Joan Shay is an award winning quilter from Cape Cod, Massachusettes. She has developed a unique appliqué technique that she calls Applibond[©]. The technique allows you to create 3dimensional designs. It is quick and easy because there is no clean finishing of edges. Two layers of fabric are bonded together and cut out on the line with no seam allowance. If bonded properly, there will be no fraying of edges. It will hold up to washing and drying. You will then be able to curl and shape the pieces. This is a really fun and easy technique to learn. For more information on her technique, go her website to www.petalplay.com



November Block of the Month

Finished size 12 inches
Title: **Loop the Loop**

I hope that you will like this block as much as I do. As November brings Thanksgiving, I made my block in red, white and blue to celebrate our national holiday. It is actually very easy to make. All the squares are 2-1/2 inches, with only two being made from triangles, the rest of it is just piecing squares. Cut: 16 squares of a dark fabric; 8 squares of white; 5 squares each of a medium print and of a light print; one triangle each of the light print and the medium print and 2 triangles of the white. Piece these together using the picture as your guide. If you have any problem please do not hesitate to contact me.



MEMBERSHIP INFO




