

PROGRAM

This month’s program will be our “**Holiday Fundraiser Bazaar.**” The event is essentially a “four-patch”: The first block will be a “**Progressive Ballot Box Raffle.**” The second block will be the “**Bake Share and Coffee/Tea.**” The third block will be “**Carnival Games of Chance.**” The fourth block will be “**Tickets in a Super Raffle.**” See **page 4** for full descriptions of all four blocks. This meeting will be open to guests without a guest fee. However, admission will be a donation to the fundraiser, even if it is only a piece of fabric. Bring along a project to work on while the afternoon progresses. We ask that you please bring a fat quarter or more

to the meeting for prizes in the games of chance. Tie a ribbon or rubber band around them if you can. Pretty is always good. Please donate fat quarters that you would not mind receiving yourself. For anyone who is not sure what a fat quarter is, the dimensions are **18” x 22”**. This gives more area for cutting big pieces than 9” x 44” will.

BOOK REVIEW

Art Quilts, a Celebration, 400 Stunning Contemporary Designs, published by Lark Press at \$24.94, in large paperback format is one of the best bargains I've come across in many years of collecting art quilts books. Whether for yourself for inspiration or as a gift for a friend or family member who doesn't know quilts can be art, but think all are nine-patches made by grandmothers, this book is a beauty. The introduction by Robert Shaw is enlightening as are the artist's notes. All the quilts were shown at Quilt Nationals between 1995 and 2003. I got mine at Barnes & Noble, but you can probably get it for less from Amazon.com. Carol Taylor (November Program) has two quilts in this book.

Empire Quilt Guild Holiday Fundraiser Bazaar December 10th

This year's fundraiser will be a "fun"-raiser. It will not be as elaborate a production as prior year's but will still give everyone a chance to get together, socialize, bid/buy a few tickets to win some great items, and try your hand at a couple games of chance. This meeting will open to guests (no guest fee) but admission will be a donation of a raffle item (see below) -- even if it is just one piece of fabric. Bring along a project to work on while the afternoon activities take place.

So, First – the ask/plea. We would like EQG members to donate Something towards the fundraiser. Ideally it is something useful and of value that you have on hand and wouldn't mind donating it to the Guild. We will then bundle it with a few other items to make a unique "package" to raffle off. We'd like you to consider "re-gifting" something you might have received and know that you will never use, or perhaps some new quilting supplies or notions where you have extra on hand. Now is the time to look in your closet for that gift you received two years ago that has not made it out of the box. For this event we'd like to take a "pass" on finished quilts or craft projects (unless you have a superb piece of work!) or "flea market" items. You can hold onto them for a meeting later in the year. For this December event we would like to receive more "upscale" donations – sorry in advance, no offense intended, but "no junk". Last, we want Fabric -- fat quarters!! Bring as many as you can since they will be the main prizes for our games of chance. Roll/elastic band or fold/ribbon them if you can. Pretty is always good.

The event is essentially a four-patch:

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>First Block</u></p> <p>Progressive Ballot Box Raffle</p> <p>This is not your ordinary auction – ticket sellers will be walking the floor selling special Progressive Ballot Box Raffle tickets for \$1 each. On these tickets you will print your name and phone number. You then take your purchased tickets and drop them into the ballot boxes in front of the prize packages that you hope to win. We hope to have between 30 and 40 "lots" of prizes in this area. For you clever ones – you can swing the odds in your favor by loading up the ballot boxes in front of items you really like – and pass over the ones that don't interest you. The drawings will start taking place by early afternoon.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Second Block</u></p> <p>Bake Share and Coffee/Tea</p> <p>Bring along some baked goods to share with everyone else. This is not a "bake sale" – this is free munchies for all attendees. Here's your chance to show off your ability with a cookie sheet/cake pan and get everyone buzzing with sugar for the day. For those of you who are oven-challenged – bring along a few sodas, coffee or teas, or paper plates/cups/napkins are always welcomed.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Third Block</u></p> <p>Carnival Games of Chance</p>  <p>We will have a couple carnival-type games of chance to get everyone in the swing of things and having a good time. There will be a thread-spool toss. Pay for a "chance", toss the spool at an array of plastic cups and win yourself fat-quarter fabrics if your aim is any good. The other game of chance will be to win some of the 60+ different quilting books and patterns generously donated by Ann Logan.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Fourth Block</u></p> <p>Tickets in A Super-Raffle</p>  <p>You know this familiar routine – however this raffle will have some "kick" to it. We hope to have some really super prizes in the raffle to push up the numbers of tickets purchased. People will be selling tickets and numbers will be drawn for the pick of the prize table during the course of the afternoon,</p>

So there you have it! **In summary:** find something and maybe a guest to bring to the December Bazaar. For those who can't attend, but want to donate, you can bring your items to the November meeting and we will have someone collect them for the Holiday Fundraiser. Gather together some fabric fat-quarters, come along in December, and have some fun.

Using batik fabric, (they look almost identical on either side with a very tight weave) **cut 7" hexagons*** *Version A:* 17 hexagons/*Version B:* 20 hexagons. Using traditional or low-loft polyester batting (100% cotton batt makes a *very flat* hexagon) **cut 3" hexagons*** *Version A:* 16 hexagons/*Version B:* 20 hexagons. **Pre-cut all hexagons and bring to the workshop due to time constraints.** Also •Sewing kit (needles, scissors, pins, etc.)•Neutral colored thread •Thimble (optional)
•Lead pencil +chalk pencil•Sharpie® permanent marker Complete the bag after the workshop with:•Buttons/beads (embellishments for hexagon centers)

•Coordinating thread for quilting lines (optional)

“New York Beauty Raffle Quilt Block” (3:30 pm – 5:00 pm)


Following the November meeting, the Raffle Quilt Committee will host a focus group to teach members how to make a New York Beauty Block.

Finally, please join Raffle Quilt Committee members at the December “Gathering”, when we will be there to work on the blocks for the raffle quilt.




Please note that we will be working on the raffle quilt during the December meeting since there will be down time between the days events. Members are also encouraged to bring their own projects to work on as well.

As December is party month there will not be a Block of the Month, so here is the one for January.

Block of the Month -- January, 2006
PATCHWORK HEART Finished size 9" x 9" (9-1/2" unfinished).


To get a head start for Valentine's Day I have borrowed this Patchwork Heart from the Fraser Valley Quilter's Guild. I have made mine from flowers, but I expect that you will find other interesting fillings for your heart. Think outside the box! Here are the very simple instructions:

Cut:

1. 15 - 2" x 2" squares of white or cream colored background fabric.
2. 17 - 2" x 2" squares of your pattern fabric
3. 2 - 2-3/8" x 2-3/8" squares of background fabric, and cut these in half diagonally
4. 2 - 2-3/8" x 2-3/8" squares of pattern fabric, cut these in half diagonally and join with the other diagonal triangles to make 4 half-square triangles
5. Assemble block in rows referring to diagram

Once again, if I can be of any help to you in making this block, please do not hesitate to call me.
