You are offered two versions: A or B. B has a wider flap. Use your favorite batiks to cut the hexagons (templates on the web site) and come prepared to be delighted and instructed. And ready to be the perfect fashionista! Any questions? call B. Hull at 718-229-4895.

Workshop Supply List: Please pre-cut all due time constraints. hexagons to CUT 7" Hexagons **b**atik fabric A: 17/B: 20 Note: Use a 'real' batik fabric for folded hexagons. Almost identical on either side of the fabric, they have a very tight weave. CUT 3" Hexagons from traditional or low-loft polyester batting A: 16/B: 20 100% cotton batt makes a VERY FLAT hexagon.

BRING:

oSewing kit (needles, scissors, pins, etc.) oNeutral colored thread oThimble (optional) oLead + chalk pencil oSharpie® permanent marker

To complete the bag after the workshop: Buttons or embellishment for each hexagon center A16 / B19 Coordinating thread for quilting lines. 1 yd cording for handle (optional). Magnetic clasp. QUILTER OF THE MONTH

Tom Cuff began collecting quilts 25 years ago. As he started to upgrade his collection, he thought it would be a good idea to see how a quilt was constructed. Tom took a class with Pat Yamin and started making crib quilts for his friends' babies. Now he has a lifetime collection of fabric.

Tom came to New York 37 years ago to study theatre at Columbia University, where he received a M.F.A. He supported himself acting in television commercials and on stage, but when he was offered a job at America Hurrah, a leading quilt dealer on Madison Avenue, he left show business. He now manages Naga Antiques, a leading dealer of Japanese screens and antiques.

Tom has been a guest lecturer and/or curator for the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the American Museum of Folk Art, the National Trust for Historic Preservation at Clivedon in Philadelphia, and the Sauder Craft Museum in his native Ohio.


This trip is offered only tentatively. If not enough members sign up, we might not be able to afford the bus!
