About twenty years ago, one day in the lobby of the Y.W.C.A. at Lexington Avenue and 53^{RD} Street – which is closed now – I noticed a sign inviting to a quilt meeting. I did not know much about quilting, but was interested since I had experience in sewing. I used to make my and my daughter's dresses. I also did machine embroidery. I attended the meeting and became a member of Empire Quilters that very day.

I started by making baby quilts that I gave to my friends for their grandchildren and small wall hangings for my home.

When I retired, I decided to devote more time to quilting and making decorative items for sale, such as wall hangings, pillows, handbags, tote bags, table runners and note cards. I sold from my house and also participated in shows such as "The Craft Alliance show," "The John the Divine Craft Show," and other neighborhood shows in the city.

When I started quilting, I studied the traditional patterns, but did not copy them. I gave them a personal touch. I like geometric patterns and also appliqué work using mostly lively colors.

After 10 years of selling my work, I retired from that business activity. I now make only charity quilts, especially lap quilts, for the Bronx Lebanon Aids care Center.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

APRIL 2006 BLOCK OF THE MONTH **PINWHEEL STAR.** Finished size 10" (10-1/2 unfinished)

This block comes to us from the Fons and Porter 2005 calendar where it was featured as a single block as well as showing an entire quilt made from the block. Directions are as follows:


You can use either four different colors (as I have) or two different colors if you choose. Please make these pastels and also use a yellow square for the center and white for the background.

The yellow center square is cut 2-1/2" x 2-1/2. The small A colored triangles are made from 4-1/4 x 4-1/4 inch squares cut twice diagnonally.


The small white A triangles are made the same way - by cutting a 4-1/4" x 4-1/4 twice diagonally.


The large half-square triangles are made by cutting a 4-7/8" x 4-7/8" square diagonally. The white rectangles measure $2-1/2 \ge 4-1/2$.

Assemble the block as shown in the picture.


EARLY MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

Refrain from infringing on the intellectual property rights of others by learning what limitations exist.

Have you ever seen the following statement on a pattern or book?

"All rights reserved. No part of this publication may be reproduced or transmitted in any form or by any means, electronic, or mechanical, including photocopy, recording, or any other information storage and retrieval system, without the written permission of the publisher."

What does this really mean? What obligations does it impose on you as a quilter? What protections does it offer to you as a quilt creator or designer? (**Continued on page 10**).

What if you just love this pattern and several friends offer to pay you to make four copies of the quilt on page 27?

What if you design an original? Are you sure it's original? If it is original, how do you protect your rights to your own creation?

Rhonda Johnson will explore the do's and don'ts of copyright...a very hot issue right now in the quilting world. Rhonda comes to us from a college environment; she is a Professor at Hostos College Library, Bronx, NY. She is often called upon to explain the fine points of "fair use" to the college community. She has also devised an information-packed program for members of the quilting community.
