May Meeting – Focus on the Future

I think this is a very important meeting for our Guild, and hope all members will make an earnest effort to attend and actively participate. I know our members have many ideas about how the Guild can better achieve the goals of promoting the understanding of all aspects of quilting and fostering good fellowship among persons in the greater New York area who are interested in quilting. But not all of your ideas make their way to the board or to the larger membership to discuss. I really hope you'll all see this as the opportunity to share what you've been thinking about (continued page 2).

She will be teaching thread choices, embroidery stitches, beading, stamping, photo attachments, and the general way to make a piece sing. Supply List: Fabric scraps (like a color, theme around it), copy of a photo to incorporate into the piece, embroidery thread to compliment your piece, embroidery needles and beading needles if you will be using beads, small piece of muslin and small piece of batting (fat 1/8 is enough), any embellishment you enjoy working with such as charms, beads, buttons, found objects, rubber stamps and pad, foils, etc.

how to improve what the Guild offers.

This meeting will be set up in the form of discussion groups of 10 – 15 people, depending on table size. If enough Board members are available, each group will have a board member to help get the discussions going, and to answer questions if possible. This will be a four-step process:

- 1. General discussion in small groups of the programs, activities and services the Guild provides, or might provide;
- 2. The entire membership then hears from each group the top 3 or 4 programs or resources they think are important to provide and plan for. I expect there'll be over lap, and we'll look to consolidate to a list of about 10 discussion topics that we consider the highest priority for further discussion.
- 3. Groups re-form to discuss planning ideas each group focusing on one particular topic
- 4. The entire membership hears from each group regarding the suggestions for the topic the group discussed

Here are some questions to think about before the meeting:

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- 1. What activities and resources do you use (e.g. program, library, focus groups, Block of the Month)? What would you try that you haven't before?
- 2. What programs and activities offered by the Guild (or another Guild) have I especially enjoyed, and why?
- 3. If you could personally plan a program or service for the Guild to offer, what would it be? For example, would you want more focus groups or programs on techniques and would you want more 'traditional' or more contemporary techniques or both. (you don't have to have a detail plan)
- 4. What sorts of books or resources would you want in the Library; raffle; etc.
- 5. What sorts of events can we have to raise money to support our programs, including our show?
- 6. What activities will increase the sense of fellowship how do we get to know one another better? (Continued page 11).



EQG Yahoo Group

Empire Quilters has set up an online Yahoo group. Many of the Guild's members are familiar with a Yahoo newsgroup and an equal number haven't a clue how these things work or what takes place in one. If you are in either of these categories now is your chance to jump into the online community because you will have your fellow Guild members there to guide you and help you along the way.

In summary, this Yahoo Group is open to paid-up members of Empire Quilters and is encourage discussion to collaboration between members. You can post messages and share photos and much, much more. It is hoped that all Empire Quilters members will eventually join the Yahoo group to provide another way of communicating within the Guild membership. At press time there were 46 members of the Guild who have signed on since the Group was launched in mid-March. We invited all persons who had an email address on the membership list but some of these invitations might have been seen as "spam" or at least "unfamiliar" since you would not be used to getting Yahoo emails from this Group. We will be conducting future invites but you don't have to wait to join. It is as simple as sending us an email to EQG-subscribe@yahoogroups.com, mention your name and that you are an Empire Quilters member. That's all you need to get going.

After you have joined you can determine how you interact with the Yahoo Group. You can elect to receive all posted messages individually, as a summary of the day's activity, or not at all. If you chose the latter option you can always go online to read the postings. The messaging is the best feature of the EQG Yahoo Group. You can ask for quilting advice, share ideas or news on Guild

activities, mention upcoming Quilt Shows or pretty much anything else that is "on topic". Besides the messages from the EQG Yahoo Group you can also post pictures, upload files relevant to quilting, or contact other Group users. This is a closed group (not open to non-Guild participants) and this "by invite only" criteria means you will be safe from spam and unwanted advertisements. It is the ideal place to get to know your other Guild members other than our monthly meetings.

If you have signed up you can always access the Group through the Yahoo Groups home page at http://groups.yahoo.com/group/EQG/. Here you will need to log in with your User ID and Password that you set up at the time of the invitation. You can also request an invite by clicking the "Join This Group" button. See you online.




UPCOMING WORKSHOP

Fabric and Pre-Cutting Preparations:

- BACKGROUND FABRIC: 3 yards total
 - Cut 16 strips 6" x width of fabric
- PATTERNED FABRICS: 9 to 12 FAT QUARTERS
 - Use different colors and patterns. Try not to select directional patterns.
 - Stack 2 or 3 fat quarters, all right side up, and cut strips along the LONGEST EDGE as follows: 1½", 2½", 3½", 4", 5½"
 - Pin together all 5 of the strips from each color grouping.
 - Repeat until all fat quarters are cut.

SHARE TABLE

This is the time of year for spring cleaning. Get all those scraps together that you've been meaning to get rid of and bring them to the scrap table. This is a great monthly fund raiser for the guild. It's a great place to find that little piece you were looking for.
