## **DYCKMAN MUSEUM PROJECT**

In addition to the "Quilt-o" Party activities, we will hear details of the upcoming **Dyckman Farmhouse Museum Quilt project**, and there will be kits available for members who want to participate. This project was approved by the membership (enthusiastically!) at our September 2006 meeting. The guild will be re-creating a 1916 quilt for the museum. As you can see from this picture of one of the blocks of the old quilt, this valuable museum piece needs replacement. Empire Quilters will duplicate the quilt with reproduction fabrics and hand appliqué` as the original was done.

This is a very exciting project for the guild. Be sure to come hear all the details. The Dyckman farmhouse is located on Broadway at 204th Street in Upper Manhattan. The house dates from the late 1790's and was donated to the City of New York as a colonial museum in 1916. ## **QUILTER OF THE MONTH**

June Calender began quilting in the early '70s. Her first quilt was a bear claw quilt in blue and white which used scraps on hand. She attended 4-5 Holstein-VanderHof quilt shows and began to think of quilts as more than scraps – actually as potential art. Through the extremely busy and life changing '80s, June quilted sporadically. During this period, she moved to NYC to pursue play-wrighting. June never stopped quilting because the gratification of a made object with immediate utility was a wonderful change from the iffy-ness of getting a play done.

June watched the flowering of the art quilt movement, reading and going to shows, admiring but not aspiring to be among them. She is very drawn to "contemporary traditional" quilts, both for beds and as wall hanging, incorporating new techniques like paper piecing and "stack and whack." June is constantly delighted by the plethora of beautiful fabric available. Stash building borders on a compulsion

June has only taken one quilt class because she has too much Midwestern independence of spirit to want to follow anyone else's directions! She has written all her life due to the need to express herself. She has published since high school. June quilts from the same impulse as the one resulting in her giving away many of her quilts. June notes that as she grows older, she finds that "self-expression in color and pattern is more and more satisfying. It doesn't replace the written word but it generates the same excitement and passion".

Many of you may know Linda Poole Prioleau from her appearances on Simply Quilts with Alex Anderson. Linda will be demonstrating how to construct her Funky Little Houses. For more information about Linda, visit her website. SUPPLY LIST: Funky Little House Pattern @ \$8.00. I will bring to class. No sewing machine. The attendees can fuse all their pieces and do some hand stitching, then, sew like crazy at home. Sewing supplies: scissors, seam rippers, rotary cutter and mat, etc. Selection of fat quarters for house, backing, roof, lawn base, lawn base back. Cottons, batiks or silk, wool and corduroy. Be creative! No grass fabric? Bring a wacky print that works fine for grass. Get out of the box!! 1 yard cotton batting. (1) 12" x 12" piece of ply wood from the hardware store, about 1/4" thick. Your favorite fabric glue. I use Sobo. Selection of threads; Cotton for basic sewing and decorative threads for embellishment and quilting (rayon, metallic, and 1 yard fusible web. An assortment polyester). of buttons, beads, yarn for embellishment. A good sense of humor and a non-messy snack to share!

## 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Traditional Quilt Blocks: Folded Fabric Date: Saturday, June 9, 2007 (New Day) Time: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. (New Time) Instructor: Lorraine Keller

Location: Fashion Institute of Technology (F.I.T.) David Dubinsky Center, 8<sup>th</sup> Floor, 27<sup>th</sup> Street and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue **Cost: \$25.00**  Lorraine Keller became interested in folded fabric as a diversion from the long process of hand quilting a large quilt. She finds it mathematically intriguing to take the inspiration of a traditional quilt block and make miniature patterns for the folded fabric technique.

#### WORKSHOP SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Rotary cutter with new blade, Cutting mat, 4" or 6" bias square ruler , iron (or Clover® mini iron), Glue stick such as Avery® (not hot glue stick), Sewing supplies (needle, thread, pins, etc.), Scraps of 3 fabrics (a light, dark, and medium), Spray starch.

Fabric with a one way design or prints with large spaces in the pattern are not suitable. Solids, tone on tone, pin dots, or overall mini print work best. These blocks make excellent quilters' Christmas tree ornaments using red, white and green fabric.

## **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

**My Mayflower Fantasy** – 8-1/2 inch unfinished block (8 inch finished)

#### Cut:

3 yellow and 3 blue 1-7/8" X 1-7/8 inch squares to form 6 half square triangles, 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" each for part of the flower and sky 6 green and 6 light blue 1-7/8" X 1-7/8 inch squares to form 12 half square triangles, 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" each for part of the stem and sky

8 yellow 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" squares for the flower 9 light blue 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" squares for the sky 4 green 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" squares for the stem 4 light blue 3-1/2" X 2-1/2 inch rectangles for the four corners

1 red 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" square for the middle of the flower

To make the  $\frac{1}{2}$  square triangles, match a blue 1-7/8" X 1-7/8" square to the corresponding yellow and green squares. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner. Sew a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch on both side of this line. Cut in half to get 6 yellow and blue half square triangles and 12 green and blue half square triangles. Measure that each is a 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" square and cut off those tiny little corner pieces.

Sew two yellow and blue  $\frac{1}{2}$  square triangles together with the yellow corner at the bottom (see diagram on next page). Then sew two yellow squares together. Sew these two to the first two pieces with the yellow squares under the yellow portion of the  $\frac{1}{2}$  square triangles. Then sew a 3-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle to either side of this unit. This whole portion is considered row 1.

For the next 3 rows, sew the squares together following the diagram.

On the 5<sup>th</sup> row, sew only the first 6 blocks together and set aside.

The  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$  rows need to have the middle three 1-1/2" X 1-1/2" squares blocks sewn

together first to form a six square block unit. To this, sew a 3-1/2" X 2-1/2" rectangle on the left side. Then sew the 5<sup>th</sup> row to the top of this block unit. Now sew the last 3-1/2" X 2-1/2" to the right side of this unit. Then sew this whole portion to the top portion, which completes the whole 8-1/2" X 8-1/2" unfinished flower block.
