PROGRAM

Family lore has it that Margot Cohen was born with a needle in her hand. She started to do embroidery when she was less than three years old and never lost her passion for needle and thread.

One of the founding members of the Long Island Quilters' Society, Margot began quilting in 1976, and she has been quilting - and talking about quilting! - Ever since. Margot is basically a traditional quilter who likes to tweak the old quilts a bit, and her

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quilts are all hand quilted. For fun, Margot says she quilts - and then quilts some more!

Her quilts have traveled to regional (one made it to Australia) and national shows and have been published in many issues of Chitra Publications, Quilt Magazine, the magazine of the National Quilting Association and more! One of Margot's quilts is in the Smithsonian. She made this quilt with former Empire member Jean Linden.

In 1976 Margot was absolutely furious that "everybody had a quilt at the county fair" and she didn't. In her group, Margot announced that for the Tri-Centennial she would have 300 quilts to make up for that deficiency. An article in the

Folk Art Museum newsletter which reported on a bus tour to Long Island claimed that they saw 300 quilts at her house. They didn't count & neither did Margot!

We are delighted that Margot will speak at our June meeting and share her work with us. You won't want to miss this. Come prepared to be inspired for you summer quilting projects.

JUNE WORKSHOP

3½" Traditional Quilt Blocks — Folded Fabric

Date: Saturday, June 9, 2007 (New Day) Time: 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. (New Time)

Instructor: Lorraine Keller

Location: Fashion Institute of Technology (F.I.T.) David Dubinsky Center, 8th Floor 27th Street and 8th Avenue

Cost: \$25.00

Lorraine Keller became interested in folded fabric as a diversion from the long process of hand quilting a large quilt. She finds it mathematically intriguing to take the inspiration of a traditional quilt block and make miniature patterns for the folded fabric technique.

WORKSHOP SUPPLIES NEEDED:

Rotary cutter with new blade, Cutting mat, 4" or 6" bias square ruler, iron (or Clover® mini iron), Glue stick such as Avery® (not hot glue stick), Sewing supplies (needle, thread, pins, etc.), Scraps of 3 fabrics (a light, dark, and medium), Spray starch.

Fabric with a one way design or prints with large spaces in the pattern are not suitable. Solids, tone on tone, pin dots, or overall mini print work best. These blocks make excellent quilters' Christmas tree ornaments using red, white and green fabric.



MAY MEETING MINUTES

Empire Quilters – Minutes From General Meeting - May 12, 2007

At the April and May Board Meetings, the Board decided several items pertaining to the Guild. In accordance with the Guild By-Laws, these decisions have to be approved by a majority of members at a General Meeting. On May 12, 2007 the following items were decided by the members at the General Meeting.

Election of Officers: President Jennifer Bigelow announced the slate of nominees for the 2007-2008 year. The membership elected the slate without opposition.

Library Funds: Michael Greenberg made a motion that the \$295.00 that the Library made this year be invested in new books. The motion was seconded by Sylvia Zeveloff and passed by the membership.

Increase in Dues: The Board suggested increases in dues and fees for all but senior members to the following amounts: \$45.00 for regular membership, \$25.00 for senior membership (no increase) \$10.00 regular guest fee, \$5.00 senior guest fee. Many seniors protested that they wanted to share in remedying the Guild's increased costs. The following decisions were made.

Marilyn Korn made a motion that regular membership dues be increased to \$45.00. This was seconded by Emily Klainberg and passed by the membership.

Joan Hellmann made a motion to increase dues for senior memberships to \$30.00. The motion was seconded by Sonia Rieber and passed by the membership.

Teresa Vega made a motion that guest fees be increased to \$10.00 for non-seniors and to \$5.00 for seniors with a limit of three (3) guest visits per year. The motion was seconded by Emily Klainberg and passed by the membership.

Rebate for Admission to Quilt Show: President Bigelow advised the membership that those who had worked at the 2007 Quilt Show were entitled to a rebate of \$8.00 on their dues. She asked that the dues be paid in full and stated that a refund would be sent to the individual members by Treasurer Kitty Squire. Again many members protested. They felt that the monies should go toward our increased costs. It was decided that those who did not want their rebate should indicate it on their membership form.



SEPTEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH


Autumn Leaves on Window Panes


(Block should be 8 ½ inches unfinished and 8 inches finished)

Take two autumn colors, a patterned white and a patterned green. Cut two 6 inch squares from each color.

Trace two oval forms from the white fabric and two oval forms from the green fabric. Appliqué the ovals, centering each diagonally on the opposite colored fabric square, green on white and white on green. If you hand appliqué the oval, add a scant quarter inch to the oval for the seam allowance. If you machine appliqué, be sure to use a stabilizer underneath the square fabric.

Now sew the squares together making sure that the white squares and the green squares are opposite each other. Finally, trim block to 8 ½ inch **unfinished**.

QUILTER OF THE MONTH

Alice Brody began quilting when her oldest nephew was born -- he's now 24 years old! This first quilt was an appliqué quilt based on Calder's Circus. Alice made up all the techniques as she went along as she "KNEW NOTHING!"

About five years later she decided to design a baby quilt for a friend who was pregnant. She did an appliqué "alphabet tree" by hand using a satin stitch around each piece, still not having not a clue as to what she was doing. After many years Alice decided to try again, and took her first real class with Diane Rode Schneck, an appliqué class at the Gazebo, (now long closed), figuring it was time to learn the "right way". Since then, Alice has taken other classes at City Quilter; mostly with Diane and Judy Doenias. She's also attended Quilting by the Lake and also a couple of stints at QSDS.

Alice's first 'real quilt', a sampler started in a class with Judy D is still in a file drawer in individual blocks, never pieced together. She now designs her own pieces, mostly for the wall, with the occasional baby quilt thrown in. One of her pieces was used as an illustration in a book by author Eileen Tabios, "I Take Thee, English, For My Beloved". She has had her work exhibited in several forums including the Surface Design Association New York Small Piece traveling show in 2007, QBL 2005, and exhibitions in CT and CA.

LOWELL QUILT FESTIVAL TRIP


