SEWING THE THREADS OF NEW YORK

In 1609, Henry Hudson set sail in the ship Halve Maen (Half Moon) from Holland's shores in search of a westward route to

Europe's trading partners in Asia. His journey led him and his crew up the wide river that now bears his name. September 2009 marks the 400th anniversary of Hudson's arrival in our harbor, which led to the establishment of what would become New York City and the towns of the Hudson Valley. In November 2009, Lefferts Historic House in Prospect Park is dedicating its 18th Annual Quilt Show to the quadric-centennial of Hudson's voyage.



Entries for Sewing the Threads of New York: The 400 Year Anniversary of Henry Hudson's Voyage can draw inspiration from Hudson's journey across the sea, from the river valley landscape, from the people the voyagers encountered along the river, or from the promise of a new colony. They can follow more obscure threads: when a final settlement was paid to Hudson's widow for instance, it was a company paid trip to India to obtain cloth and quilts. They can focus on the changes that have occurred to the harbor and river over the 400 years or on what has remained the same. They can focus on the color and sheen of water, or on the letters in Henry Hudson's name. Wherever the imagination goes!

Quilts will be on exhibit at Lefferts Historic House Nov 1-29, 2009, and at Prospect Park Audubon Center at the Boathouse from Dec 5- 27, 2009. Only the first 150 quilts/clothing will be accepted. Non-guild members are limited to two (2) quilt entries. There is an entry fee of \$15.00 for one OR two quilts. Make checks payable to ELIQG. One form must be filled out for each quilt being entered. You may copy the entry form if entering more than one quilt/clothing item.

Rules/Info: Quilts or clothing entered must have been constructed by the person/persons entering the entry(s) and must not have appeared in earlier ELIQG shows. Quilts/clothing entered do not have to match the show theme. Quilts entered in the Empire Urban Inspirations Show may be entered in this show. Quilt delivery is at Suffolk Community College, Riverhead, NY between 3:00 pm and 7:00 pm on Tuesday, June 2, 2009 in the large dining room in the Peconic Building.

There is also a block contest open to non-guild members. The theme is "Go Green for a Better World". Blocks must be 12 ¹/₂" x 12 ¹/₂" to finish 12". You must use the color green in the block but are not limited to that color. Your block may be pieced or appliquéd or a combination of both. Your block may be embellished **BUT NOT** quilted. The block as well as a fee of \$3.00 (for each block submitted) must be received at the following address by **May 1, 2009: Liz Doyle, 63 Squiretown Rd., Hampton Bays, NY 11946** All blocks received will be judged and winning blocks will be assembled into a quilt top. The makers of the winning blocks will be entered into a drawing for the quilt top. The top will be on display at the June 6 and 7, 2009 show. All participants will receive a gift.
