Charity Day

PROGRAM

Hello everyone – it's time for our annual Charity Quilting Day. We come together as a guild, as friends, as quilters to make as many quilts as possible for charities that Empire Quilters gladly support. The fun and the work go on all day – starting around 10:00 a.m. Please come as early as you can, and stay as late as you're able. Bring your family and friends – there is no charge for guests on Charity day. Whether you're a new quilter, or an experienced quilter, or you have never made quilt before, we have work you can do. There are many experienced quilters who will be very happy to teach you what to do. You'll have fun with friendly people, and you just might learn something new. One of

the best things is that you get to really interact with other guild members who could become good friends.

Bring your ideas; bring sewing supplies such as pins, scissors, needles, and yarn or embroidery floss for tying the quilts; fabric for tops, quilt tops, and quilt-backing fabric. Though the Charity committee takes fabric donations during the year, and pulls larger pieces of fabric from the Share table, we're always glad to have more fabric donated for Charity Day – we often get lots of tops without backs. Also, if you can manage it, we could use some large cutting mats, rotary cutting rulers and sharp rotary cutters for preparing fabrics for the quilts we'll make that day. If you bring your sewing machine or serger (and we hope several people will) remember to bring a long extension cord. Most importantly—bring yourself!

Denise Walsh-Horowitz has an iron available for pressing fabrics and for pressing on Guild donation labels. Jennifer Bigelow and Shirley Clark will be photographing the quilts to show on our website. City Quilter, once again, is donating the batting that we'll use for our Charity Day quilts, and we heartily thank them for that.

If you want some ideas of how to make easy charity projects, visit the Service page on Empire Quilters' website. There are patterns for easy quilts, for stuffed animals and even for knitting caps for preemies. You'll find guidelines to follow if you select to make a different pattern, and some easy quilt assembly suggestions. Last year we made over 100 quilts — and we certainly want to beat that number.



In April, Betty Pillsbury will give a lecture on "Why I am a Crazy Quilter." Betty is an award winning textile artist and accomplished instructor. She is perhaps best known as one of the foremost experts in Crazy Quilting and embellishments. She is the recipient of almost 200 awards for her pieces, and was the recipient of the Embroiderer's Guild of America Educator's Award of Excellence. Betty has written articles for many publications, and has lectured and taught all over the country.

Betty will teach a workshop on Sunday, April 11. The class is a crazy quilt notebook sampler that will give "crazies" — from beginners to advanced — a little taste of everything. Bead a dragonfly; learn a needle-woven leaf; stitch a spider web; make a bullion rose; create a pansy from wired ribbon. This is a fun sampling of techniques. All by Hand!
